MATCH PREVIEWS

Holcombe host their first, first-team double-header of the season as our W1s take on Slough (2pm) and M1s face Oxted (6pm) on Saturday.

Both sides have made good starts to their respective campaigns with Nick Bandurak's side sitting 3rd in the Vitality Division One South after two wins in three matches and Barry Middleton's team one of five sides level on nine points at the top of the Premier Division after four matches.

Slough have also made a strong start, sitting just a point and place above Holcombe with two wins and a draw in their first three, meaning Bandurak's side could move above their opponents with a victory.

Emma Bandurak will hope to continue her positive early-season form with three goals in three matches, while Lottie Bingham will be looking to build on scoring her first goal for the club last weekend against Sevenoaks.

Oxted, meanwhile, have won one and drawn one of their first four games, sitting in ninth place. They are without a win since the opening day when they beat East Grinstead, since losing to Wimbledon and Hampstead & Westminster, and drawing to Cardiff & Met.

Phil Roper and Bandurak have scored 13 goals between them in six matches so far this campaign and will hope to continue that run of form heading into Saturday's fixture.

Entry at Holcombe Park is free for both matches on Saturday.



MATCH REPORT: M1S 4-2 RACING CLUB DE FRANCE

Holcombe progressed to the KO8 of the Euro Hockey League (EHL) with a 4-2 win over Racing Club de France on Friday afternoon.
Goals from Nick Bandurak (2), Phil Roper and Tom Russell set up a tie on Sunday afternoon against hosts Real Club de Polo de Barcelona.



Barry Middleton's side took the lead just seven minutes in when a good move down the right led to a ball across goal that the falling Bandurak turned home past the opposition goalkeeper.

Before the first break, however, the French side were level Christophe Peters-Deutz's drag-flick found the net.

Holcombe deservedly re-took the lead in the second period through more excellent work down the right. Brad Read passed down the line for Rhodri Furlong to deflect a cross into the circle for Roper to finish calmly into the bottom left corner.

Middleton's side extended their lead midway through the third quarter when a high ball in the circle came the way of Russell, who volleyed



home from close range for his second goal of the season.

Peters-Deutz got his second from a rebound at another penalty corner with just over ten minutes to play but any hopes of a late comeback were extinguished just two minutes later as Bandurak netted his seventh goal in five matches this season and seventh EHL goal for Holcombe in five appearances.

Sam Taylor, once again excellent at the back, stepped forward from defence and found the captain in space, who calmly took a touch and finished past the goalkeeper to make sure of Holcombe's spot in Sunday's last eight.

Holcombe were knocked out of the Euro Hockey League (EHL) at the KO8 stage with Sunday's defeat to hosts Real Club de Polo de Barcelona.

Barry Middleton's side progressed to the KO8 following Friday's 4-2 win over Racing Club de France, with the Spanish side defeating French champions CA Montrouge 4-1.

Carlos Garcia Cuenca's team took the lead inside 30 seconds. Great Britain goalkeeper Ollie Payne made a double save but the attack stayed alive and Guillermo Fortuño was on hand to poke home from close



Holcombe came back into the game but the hosts sat back, limiting their ability to create chances from open play against a low block.

They did, though, come close through two penalty corners with Tim Guise-Brown hitting the post before Nick Bandurak saw another corner



effort saved by Luis Calzado.

Polo also had two corners of their own before half-time but they were well-defended by Holcombe.

The third quarter saw Holcombe try to push forward without creating any clear-cut chances, with opportunities also limited in the final quarter as the pressure took its toll, with some passes just a fraction off and a couple of loose touches costing Holcombe chances.

Two late green cards made the last ten minutes difficult before Middleton's side won two late penalty corners, the first mis-trapped at the top of the circle before the second forced a good save. They were perhap unlucky not to have one more corner opportunity when Calzado appeared to push the ball off the backline from the second corner.

Holcombe are back in action on Saturday in the Premier Division against Oxted (6pm) as part of the first, first-team double-header of the season with Holcombe's women in Vitality Division One South action against Slough at 2pm.

FLASHBACK: SAM **OUEK**By Jaime Field

In 2014, Sam Quek joined Holcombe from Reading, her time at Holcombe saw the defender make many appearances for the first team.

She remained with the Holcs until her eventual departure in 2017 when she joined Bowdon Hightown.

She had an accomplished international career, with over 120 caps for Great Britain and England, including being part of the famous gold medal-winning side in Rio 2016, which she described as "pure joy and almost disbelief as well," to The Guardian.

She also has medals from the 2014 Commonwealth Games, and the 2013 and 2015 EuroHockey Championships.


Hockey has not always been her only sport - at the age of 16, Quek had to make a choice between becoming a professional footballer or a professional hockey player. At the time she played hockey but was also in the Tranmere Rovers squad.

She told The Guardian, "I was never in the first team at Tranmere, always in the reserves. I ended up playing a bit more hockey and I fell in love with it."

Since the end of her hockey career, she has had more opportunities to play football with Liverpool Women, but turned the opportunity down.

After her retirement as an athlete, she appeared on the ITV reality tv series, 'I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here!', finishing in fourth place.

She has since been a presenter for a variety of different sports, including American football and football. She has now settled into a permanent role as a team captain on A Question of Sport, which she later referred to as: "my dream job." Quek still remains part of the show after two years.

CAPTAINNICK BANDURAK: EHL DEFEAT 'FRUSTRATING'

Holcombe captain and women's first-team head coach Nick Bandurak conceded he was frusrated with his side's Euro Hockey League (EHL) KO8 defeat to Real Club de Polo de Barcelona, but acknowledged they have enjoyed a positive start to the season overall.

Holcombe currently sit in third place in the Premier Division having opened up with three wins in four matches, one of five teams sat on nine points at this stage.



Bandurak has scored seven goals in six matches in all competitions with five of those coming in the league. He has scored braces this season against Southgate and Racing Club de France (EHL KO16). England and Great Britain teammate Phil Roper also has six goals, with the pair linking up brilliantly well at the start of the campaign.

Barry Middleton's side progressed to the KO8 following a 4-2 win over

Racing Club last Friday afternoon, with that victory teeing up a tie on Sunday against either hosts Polo or French champions CA Montrouge. Polo ran out 4-1 winners against Montrouge to compete for a spot in the FINAL 8 at Easter.

The hosts took the lead within 30 seconds and Holcombe were unable to level the scores.

Bandurak said: "It's been a good start, we've played some good stuff and scored some good goals which has been great.

"A big focus for us in this early part was about preparing for the EHL and giving it a really good go - we're obviously very disappointed with how that ended on Sunday but we've got no time to rest on it because we're straight back into the league now for the next few weeks.



"It's important that we make sure we're dialled back into that as quickly as possible.

"I love playing with Phil. It's nice that we've been able to build on the start we made together last year and it's good that we get the chance to spend so much time on the pitch together and naturally the more we do that, the better our connection is going to be in the way we can read each other's game and movements.

"It's nice to see that come out with an objective measure of how well we're doing at the start of the year so it's good that we've hit the ground running but it's obviously a very long season and we're only a few games in so it's important for everyone that we just keep that going.

"I think it always has to be [on aiming to get back to the EHL next season] - everyone who gets a taste of the EHL always loves it and the opportunity to go again is massive.

"Certainly when it gets to that point at the back end of the season, that will be a focus for us as it will for every team fighting in the play-offs.

"Having a taste of it and getting some experience in this group, many of whom hadn't played in the EHL before, is a big step forwards. Obviously it didn't finish how we wanted it to finish but there's a lot of learning that can be done off the back of that.

"Getting a chance to go again will be a big and to do that in the very next season would be fantastic but there's obviously a long way to go between now and then.



"I'd be lying if I said it wasn't frustrating. We got caught cold in the first 30 seconds and ultimately that was the difference between the two teams.

"The higher the level you play, the smaller the margins between the teams and ultimately it was that first 30 seconds that got us.

"We didn't play great as a team in that game, we didn't play to the level that we're capable of and that, I think, is the biggest frustration.

"We weren't outclassed, we feel as though it's our own doing that we

didn't make it through to Easter and that's probably the hardest bit to take but credit to Polo, they put on a fantastic event, dug in deep in that game and ultimately got the result that they wanted.

"They've been great [the new signings]. Louis and Brad have been at the club before, they know the set-up, the people behind the scenes, the majority of the group as a whole so it's been seamless with them transitioning in and Pendle's done great at the top end of the field and again is a really good lad who's got settled in quickly. He's got some familiar faces around which have helped him with that.

"They've brought a lot both on the field and off it, it's been a really smooth transition for all three of them which has been great." Bandurak will resume both coaching and playing this weekend as Holcombe's women take on Slough (2pm) ahead of the men's match against Oxted (6pm) in Holcombe's first home double-header of the season.



Slough currently sit one point and one place above Holcombe in the Vitality Division One South table having drawn with Sevenoaks on the opening day before wins against newly-promoted Southgate and Barnes, while Oxted are ninth in the Premier Division with four points from four matches.

"I love doing it all on the same day, mainly because days off are rare to find these days so having one on a Sunday is a game-changer throughout the week! "I love the general energy around the double-headers and the excitement that builds throughout the day as well. It's really nice to be able to go straight from one to the other with regards to coaching then playing so from that perspective, I'm a big fan of it and I expect Saturday to be another day of really good energy and atmosphere around the club.

"Slough are a great club, they've got a really good team and have done well in this league for a number of years now and have recently been in the Premier Division.

"I'm expecting them to be a tough, physical side, they've gone unbeaten to start the season which is always a positive trait to keep picking up points week in, week out.

"They'll come in with confidence no doubt and it'll be important for us to manage that early doors, build into the game and then hopefully start to assert ourselves in the way that we like to play and start to play our brand of hockey.

"I'm expecting a very tough game, it'll be close either way and no doubt it'll come down to who takes their chances better on the day.

"Oxted's always a tough fixture, we're thankful to be straight back at home after a trip away - we had some fantastic support out in Barcelona so we're looking forward to getting that again on Saturday night.

"It was always going to take Oxted a little bit of time given the amount of new signings they've had, they've made some real quality acquisitions in the summer and with a number of new faces it will take them a little bit of time to bed in.

"Now they've got the first month or so under their belt, I'm expecting them to start clicking and we're going to be in for a tough game on Saturday evening. From our perspective, we can only control what we can control which is just making sure we're dialled into what makes us play well as a team and making sure we can get back into domestic form pretty quickly after the weekend just gone."

Following relegation, Bandurak made six additions to his squad over the summer for Holcombe's first ever Vitality Division One campaign, including junior international Lottie Bingham who scored her first goal for Holcombe last weekend against Sevenoaks.

New Zealand international Brad Read also joined as assistant coach alongside Hayden Phillips as a defensive specialist. Holcombe are yet to concede from a penalty corner this season and have also scored from four in three matches.

"Very pleased [with the start]. Similarly to Oxted, we've got a number of new faces so naturally it's going to take a bit of time to bed in. We've created more than enough chances in every game to win those games.

"The Surbiton game was an even, back-and-forth contest, the stats would show that and Surbiton came out on the right side of that, credit to them. From our perspective, we're pleased with the amount of opportunities we created in that game and feel as though we created enough to win it, they'd probably say the same.

"If we weren't creating those chances, that'd be something to be slightly concerned about. The more we play together and people start to learn more about each other's games and find those connections, the better we're going to be.

"The pleasing thing is we were able to put the goals away at the weekend and a shut-out is always pleasing, especially against a tough side like Sevenoaks.

"Hopefully that's a bit of a catalyst for us moving forward now into what's going to be a busy period for us in this stretch through to Christmas.

"The girls have done really well, the new faces within the group have settled in quickly and we're starting to see those connections building every week now in training so I'm looking forward to seeing that transitioning into Saturdays.

"I'm buzzing for her, Lottie's done brilliantly well to get herself settled and playing the style of attacking hockey that she does so well. "For her to score her first goal, at home as well, is testament to the hard work that she's put in at the start of this year and it'll be one of many I'm sure.

"To get another penalty corner goal at the weekend was great. We had to put a lot of work into that, we struggled a bit with it last season, our conversion rate was pretty low last year so it's something that ultimately wins and loses games.

"The most pleasing thing has been our PCD, we've had no goals against in three games which is fantastic. The girls have taken real ownership and pride in making sure that is something that they can be really tough on themselves with, that's a real positive trait we've got.

"The PCA, to have the conversion rate that we have so far, is great but the more we play, the more important it's going to get so it's been a good start but for now that's all it is, it's important we carry that through for as long as possible.

"The main reason for Brad coming on board was that we wanted a specialist in that line to help our defensive unit both on and off-theball.

"That specialist knowledge is something that Brad has brought in abundance and I know the girls love having him around as well.

"From our perspective, it helps to have that third person that the girls can go to with any questions or queries.

Brad knows the set-up, knows the club and therefore, again, his transition into the group has been pretty seamless which has been a huge asset to us and a massive help to myself in particular."

If it wasn't for the graphics that we put out through the Holcombe account, I'd have no idea what the table is looking like.

"I genuinely have no interest through this first half of the season, the most important thing from my perspective is trying to get our group to gel as quickly as possible and focus on what we can control which is how we're playing and what our processes are in order for us to play well.

"It's different in terms of a couple of second teams being in this league but they're from clubs with a huge amount of depth so there's real quality within those teams as well.

"It has to be something that we respect and certainly Surbiton's start to this season is real testament to that. It doesn't change anything about our approach or table-watching, anything like that.

"Ultimately, if we control what we can control then we'll be fine. We just need to make sure we're guarded to our processes and whatever else happens around the league happens.

"We've got a really good set-up here with our youngsters coming through.

"Tilly [Woodhead] is fantastic, she's made to play at this level and above.

"It's really nice to see her grow into this role week-on-week and ultimately set herself up for where she's headed which is a very long career in this game.

"It's nice to see her growth in understanding and learning some of the extra nuances of playing the game at this level. It's really pleasing to see her in the form that she's in.

"Hannah's [Carney] done brilliantly through this season and the end of last, actually.

"She's managing a bit of an ongoing injury at the moment so it's important that she works hard to get on top of this and then that will give her the chance to come back in and compete for a place.

"Alongside the new signings, some of our youngsters coming through is really positive."

Umpiring Corner

With junior matches on Sundays coming thick and fast, there are plenty of opportunities to get involved and start your umpiring journey. On October 15th, we have another U16 match at Holcombe Park with our girls taking on Ashford at 11:00am. If you are able to umpire this match, please do let me know.

If you umpire but are not yet L1 qualified, there are benefits that come with doing the course and getting assessed, none less than obtaining free membership to the EH Insurance. Please do consider taking two hours out of your time to do the course and then we can get you assessed. The courses through to Christmas are now available on this link England Hockey's Online Training Hub.

The date is to be confirmed around the junior match schedule, but we will be holding a forum for all umpires (qualified or otherwise) so we can run through some good habits to keep, some bad habits to avoid and some pre-match discussions to have and we can also go through any questions that have come from the first few weeks of umpiring. From recent experience, I can also feedback on the process for red cards in the hope that it never proves necessary to be used! This will be on a Sunday morning as our Saturdays are busy enough. It is likely to be at 10:00am or 10:30am.

As September is over, we have our first Umpire of the Month! September's award, and an additional 25 team of year points for his side, goes to Ian Shelley. Despite only having two weeks of league games, Ian has managed to umpire three matches as well as play both weeks. Our umpires of the week for October 7th go to Jon Baker and Rob Brunt. Jon is injured so not playing, but came up to umpire two matches, covering the 10:30am and 12:00pm matches. On top of everything else Rob does for the club, he stepped in to umpire at 11:00am before his game at 3:00pm, and was then coaching the W1s at 5:00pm as the usual coaches were away at the Euro Hockey League in Barcelona. Thanks to you three and all other umpires that put themselves out each week to make sure our games go ahead.

NPUA umpire and Executive Committee member Chris Blogg was

taken seriously ill during the City of Peterborough versus Barford Tigers match on Sunday afternoon. Thanks to the quick thinking and compassion of members from both clubs, plus the presence of a defibrillator on site, Chris received life-saving support at the pitch and was air-lifted to hospital. He is recovering in hospital in Kettering.

At Holcombe Park, we have a defibrillator located on the wall next to the bar. You do not need training to use this, the machine talks you through what you need to do step-by-step and it will not work unless it is needed. It is important that as many people as possible know the location, and can act swiftly if needed. Please do take a moment when next at the club to look for where it is. We know how important quick action can be after our very own Trevor Foster received excellent care himself, albeit not at a sporting venue.

- Inspirational International Success: inspirational club and national teams delivering podium success in Europe and on the world stage, underpinned by a thriving talent system and domestic game.

Moreover, the 'Creating A Future For Our Game Together' strategy aligns with Sport England's 'Uniting the Movement' strategy and UK Sport's 'Powering Success, Inspiring Impact' strategic plan - both aiming to transform lives and enable extraordinary moments.




