MATCH PREVIEW

Holcombe are hoping to earn their fourth consecutive Premier Division win as Wimbledon travel to Holcombe Park on Sunday afternoon (3pm) in the second part of this weekend's double-header.

The home side have won five of their first six so far this season, and have beaten Surbiton (3-2), Oxted (1-0) and East Grinstead (7-1) in their last three to sit third in the table.

Wimbledon, meanwhile, are sixth with three wins and three defeats in their first six, including losing their last two to Surbiton and, yesterday, Hampstead & Westminster.

The two sides met in both Phase One and Phase Two last season, drawing 2-2 at Holcombe Park in Phase One before Holcombe took all three points at Wimbledon in a 3-2 victory, with goals coming from Nick Bandurak (2) and Tom Russell.

Confidence will be high in the Holcombe squad following their impressive start, and even more so following yesterday's dismantling of East Grinstead, in which Alex Pendle scored his first two Holcombe goals.

Phil Roper is up against his former side while Sam Hooper is returning to Holcombe Park with the visitors, having spent a season with the club.

Victory could potentially see Holcombe go top of the table, while a win for Karl Stagno's side could lift them to fifth, depending on Beeston's result.

Entry at Holcombe Park is free on Sunday, while updates will be posted across our social media channels.



MATCH REPORT: EAST GRINSTEAD 1-7 M1S

Holcombe earned their fifth Premier Division win in six matches and third on the bounce as they beat East Grinstead 7-1 in a dominant display on Saturday afternoon.

Rob Field set the visitors on their way with a goal at the end of the first quarter before three goals in six second quarter minutes from Tim Guise-Brown, Tom Russell and Alex Pendle took the game away from East Grinstead. Pendle added his second Holcombe goal in the third period before Phil Roper and Russell piled further misery on to the hosts in the final quarter. Dan Faulkner scored a late consolation.

The tone was set early on in terms of Holcombe's dominance as Barry Middleton's side spurned a number of chances before taking the lead.

First, Russell found space in the circle and looked for Sam Taylor to deflect home, the ball passing narrowly wide of the ffar post with just six minutes on the clock.

A minute later, Hayden Phillips struck a powerful effort wide before Pendle fired a reverse-stick shot into the sideboard.

Pendle came close to deflecting an awkward Taylor hit home after a penalty corner was mis-trapped before Holcombe finally got their goal at the end of the first quarter.

Field broke into the circle after an incisive move, linking up with Phillips, and finished on the reverse to break the deadlock.

Early in the next period, Guise-Brown made it 2-0 with a superb drag-flick past the goalkeeper.

The hosts slapped a penalty corner of their own wide minutes later before Russell added a third. The move starting from a sixteen with Taylor and involving a number of players. Middleton picked up the ball just inside the opposition half, releasing Field who found Jake Owen in the centre of the circle unmarked, Owen able to tee up Russell for a simple finish into an open goal.

Roper was released down the left-hand side just a couple of minutes later, showcasing his dribbling skill as he turned defenders inside-out, playing a great pass through to Pendle who finished smartly through the 'keeper's legs to open his Holcombe account.

It could have been even more before half-time, too, as Middleton pushed an effort just wide of the far post from Roper's through ball before the provider turned shooter, hitting a shot off-target after breaking into the circle.

East Grinstead started the third quarter well with two penalty corners in the opening seven minutes, the first turned away on the line by Roper before Ollie Payne made a good save to deny the hosts.

Holcombe, though, still looked threatening when they were in possession.

Pendle had a goal disallowed for a backstick after finishing well before he was able to poke a lose ball home to make it 5-0 after it came loose in the circle, Roper forcing an initial save from the goalkeeper.

Roper nearly got on the end of a cross at the far post early in the final period before eventually scoring just past the hour mark. Russell found the Great Britain man in the circle and there was no mistake from close range as he made it six.

Pendle teed up Russell for a seventh a few minutes later, lifting the ball over the onrushing 'keeper before the hosts won a late penalty corner, with Faulkner beating Payne to score.

Holcombe face Wimbledon at home on Sunday (3pm) while East Grinstead travel to Hampstead & Westminster (2pm). Entry is free at Holcombe Park.

MATCH REPORT: HARLESTON MAGPIES 1-6 W1s

Holcombe made it four wins from five Vitality Division One South wins and three consecutive victories as they beat strugglers Harleston Magpies 6-1 on Saturday afternoon.

Following home wins over Sevenoaks and Slough, Nick Bandurak's side travelled to Suffolk looking for their second away win of the season, previously beating Southgate and losing to Surbiton 2s on the road.

Lucy Whalley, Emma Bandurak (2), Lottie Bingham and Deanna Ritchie (2) were all on the scoresheet to make it 12 goals in their last three matches for Holcombe.

The away side took a first-quarter lead through summer signing Whalley, who scored her first goal for the club from open play, but the hosts were level before the end of the first period.

Bandurak re-established Holcombe's lead in the second quarter from a penalty stroke before Bingham doubled the advantage heading into half-time.

Bandurak added another goal from the penalty spot in the final period.

Holcombe remain second in the table ahead of next week's cup match away to Conference West side Trojans. They are back in league action against Team Bath Buccaneers on Saturday, 4th November.

MATCH REPORT: M1S 1-0 OXTED

Holcombe made it four wins from five Premier Division matches with their 1-0 win over Oxted on Saturday evening as Sam Taylor scored the only goal of a tightly-contested affair.

Barry Middleton's side returned to league action after last weekend's Euro Hockey League (EHL) campaign and are one of four teams on 12 points at the top of the Premier Division, currently sitting fourth on goal difference heading into a double-header weekend.

The first opportunity came the way of the hosts as a free-flowing passing move saw Tom Russell and Alex Pendle link up in the circle, the former's pass across goal almost turned home by a diving Hayden Phillips at the far post.

Holcombe tried to build play by baiting the Oxted press but on one occasion played themselves into trouble when Taylor lost possession in midfield, the visitors breaking and forcing a double save from goalkeeper Ollie Payne.



Payne was again called into action before half-time as neat Oxted play found a forward in space, his tame effort kept out comfortably.

The hosts did also have a goal disallowed when a loose ball in the circle came the way of Phil Roper to turn home.

Holcombe kept pushing for a winner and almost found one when Taylor launched an aerial into the circle to find Phillips. The New Zealand international played a one-two with Middleton before almost turning provider this time, playing a ball across goal which narrowly evaded Pendle, still searching for his first Holcombe goal.



With little over five minutes to play, the home side finally broke the deadlock. Roper's penalty corner effort was saved and bounced up into the air, with the onrushing injector Taylor coming in to volley into the top corner from close range for his second goal of the season.



Oxted struggled to create any chances for an equaliser as Holcombe controlled the ending of the match with both sides down to ten players after two late yellow cards.

Holcombe moved up to second in the Vitality Division One South table with a 3-1 win over Slough on Saturday afternoon courtesy of Deanna Ritchie's hat-trick.

The hosts have won three of the first four matches, only losing to tabletoppers Surbiton 2s, who still have a 100% record.

Slough travelled to Holcombe Park for the first meeting between the two sides since the 2018/19 season, when Holcombe topped the regular season Premier Division table to reach the League Finals while Slough were relegated after finishing ninth and then third in the Play-Offs.

Nick Bandurak's side made the better start of the two sides, Ritchie opening the scoring with her first goal for the club after just a few minutes as she powerfully fired home after picking up a loose ball inside the circle.

Lottie Bingham also forced Slough's goalkeeper into action early on with a reverse effort while Holcombe saw a couple of penalty corner efforts well-defended by the visitors.

The hosts were largely in control in the first half, Slough not really testing Tilly Woodhead with most of their attacking opportunities coming on the counter-attack.

Bandurak's side could have perhaps added to their lead when Leisa Randall broke through on goal before the break, rounding the 'keeper before looking to play a square ball to Marian Ledesma, but the pass was hit on the stretch and bobbled across, with Slough defending well to ensure the deficit remained just one goal heading into the break.

The second half was more even, Holcombe still controlling the ball for spells but the visitors' counter-attacks were looking more dangerous and they won more penalty corners.



Jules Inverdale levelled for the away side in the third quarter, her penalty corner effort the first Holcombe have conceded from the set piece all season.

Holcombe, though, looked the most likely to grab a winner in the final quarter and they deservedly re-took the lead through Ritchie's second.



With just a few minutes left to play, New Zealand international Ritchie completed her hat-trick, finishing from close range to ensure Holcombe took the three points and made it two wins from two home matches in 2023/24.

FLASHBACK: MADDIE HINCH

The Olympic gold medal in 2016 will always be the career highlight for all members of the squad, and Maddie Hinch is no different.

Hinch was viewed as a pivotal player between the posts, as she saved four shootouts to guarantee the win for her nation. She made her 100th international appearance during The Games, racking up a total of 157 overall for England and Great Britain.

Some of her other achievements include an Olympic bronze medal in Tokyo, a gold medal at the 2022 Commonwealth Games and a EuroHockey Championship gold in London in 2015.

These achievements helped to land her the FIH Best Goalkeeper award three times in consecutive years from 2016 to 2018.

Her Holcombe career ended synonymously with the historic Rio run as she moved on to Dutch club HC Tilburg.

In 2023 she announced her retirement from international hockey, saying: "I have lived my childhood dream and given all that I can to the badge."

Having a fifteen-year spell as her country's keeper, she said: "I know I can no longer give 100% of me to the number one shirt so I have decided to retire."

In 2017, after winning gold, Hinch founded MH1 Coaching, a camp designed to develop goalkeepers across the world.

Originally, the aim was to hold a singular goalkeeping camp but the project has grown far beyond that to not only keepers, but outfield players and even coaches.

Currently, MH1 runs workshops in England and South Africa.





McCallin calls time on glittering international career (England Hockey)



Olympic Champion Shona McCallin MBE has made the decision to retire from international hockey after a career that has seen her achieve gold medals at Olympic, European and Commonwealth Games levels.

McCallin made her Olympic debut at the Rio 2016 Games having been part of the 2015 European gold medal-winning team in London.

McCallin is also one of only a handful of players to have won backto-back Olympic hockey medals after qualifying for Tokyo 2020 and winning bronze with the team.

After careful consideration and 122 caps, McCallin has decided now is the right time to take a step away from international competition.


"Today, I announce my retirement from international hockey," McCallin said. "This decision has not come lightly, but after many hours of thought, I know now the time is right. They say when you know, you know.

"Over the last 10 years, interspersed with more injuries than I would have liked, I have been fortunate to be part of some of the most successful of times with GB and England: Olympic, Commonwealth and European gold medals plus an Olympic bronze medal in Tokyo. Being able to share these moments with teammates, staff, friends and family will stay with me forever.

"However, over the last few months, I've come to realise that the mental and physical energy required to be part of the centralised program is

just not there anymore. I am not, and will never be, someone who can only commit to something 80% or 90%.

"After careful consideration, and consultation with family and close friends, I have decided that it is time to hang up my stick when it comes to international hockey. It's time to pass the number 24 shirt to someone new, who I hope can wear it with the same pride, grit and determination I did in every single game. Train hard so matches are easier."



McCallin took up the sport at just six-years-old at the Newark Otters and Beavers club and never looked back. She was a successful member of England Hockey's U16, U18 and U21's teams and also captained the U21 team to the Junior World Cup.

"I am incredibly thankful for the support I've received recently whilst making this difficult decision, especially from my family and close friends," McCallin said. "Some have been with me from the very start when I was 6-year-old Shona starting at Newark Hockey Club.

"I would also like to express my gratitude to my coaches, teammates, and all the staff who have been a part of my hockey journey. Many are friends for life, and that is the power that sport can have."

McCallin won't be saying goodbye to the sport completely and will be representing her club as a player and a coach at the England Hockey Premier Division.

"I am not saying goodbye to the world of hockey entirely," McCallin concluded. "I am continuing to play and coach with Reading Hockey Club whilst continuing to put effort into my new supplement business, The Ten Per Cent Club. I am excited about what the future will hold.

"As the Great Britain squad work towards an important part of their Paris Qualification journey, I want to wish the players and staff all the best for the upcoming months."

England and Great Britain Hockey Performance Director, Ed Barney, said: "Shona has made a phenomenal contribution to England and Great Britain Hockey through a period of true women's excellence. Her contribution to European, Commonwealth and Olympic titles and a vibrant, values driven programme has been truly exceptional.

"It is no coincidence that Shona's tenacity, game intellect and individual skills has mirrored the brightest period of women's hockey in recent decades. We will miss Shona, but we wish her every success and contentment in all her future ventures. I have no doubt she will continue to tread new paths, inspire future generations and thrive in whatever she pursues."
