# MATCH PREVIEW - W1s VS. CANTERBURY

Holcombe are looking to return to winning ways and extend their unbeaten run to six matches as they host Kent rivals Canterbury on Saturday afternoon (2pm) in the Vitality Division One South.

Nick Bandurak's side are second in the table, five points behind unbeaten Surbiton 2s and ahead of Barnes on goal difference. Canterbury sit three points further back in fifth, behind another Kent side in Sevenoaks on goal difference.

Jade van der Zwan will be hoping to get on the scoresheet again having scored her first Holcombe goal against the Buccaneers, while Deanna Ritchie will be looking to continue her goalscoring form - another brace on Saturday made it eight goals in four games for the New Zealander.

Tilly Tillings, still searching for her first Holcombe goal, will be relishing the chance to face her former club having moved from Canterbury to join up with Bandurak's side in the summer.

The visitors are the lowest scorers in the division with just seven goals in six matches, also conceding seven - giving them the second-best defensive record, with Holcombe having conceded two more. The hosts, though, have scored almost three times as many goals as Canterbury, with 19 strikes.

The two sides have not met in a competitive outdoor fixture since 2018/19, when Holcombe finished top of the Premier Division table and Canterbury rock bottom. Holcombe won 2-1 at Holcombe Park in October, courtesy of goals from Sofia Viarengo and Dirkie Chamberlain.

# MATCH PREVIEW -M1s VS. CARDIFF & MET

By Lucas Ball Holcombe are looking for their third consecutive Premier Division win as they host newly-promoted Cardiff & Met on Saturday evening (6pm).

Having scored 22 goals in their last two matches, Barry Middleton's men will be in a confident mood coming into the fixture, with a top-six spot for Phase Two already secured.

Tom Russell netted a hat-trick last time out against Beeston to back up his brace against the University of Nottingham, and is now on nine goals for the season in all competitions, eight of those coming in league action.

Phil Roper, too, looked sharp against strugglers Beeston, who have now conceded 35 goals in their last four games. A brace took his tally to 10 so far this campaign, only behind Great Britain teammate Nick Bandurak in the Holcombe scoring charts, with Bandurak on 16 goals.

The two sides have never met in a competitive fixture and Cardiff currently sit just outside the relegation zone, four points ahead of Reading and seven ahead of the point-less University of Nottingham. Their two Premier Division wins have come against those sides, with their sole draw coming against Oxted at the end of September.

The Welsh outfit have conceded 21 in their last three and 40 overall, giving them the joint-third-worst defensive record while Holcombe possess the third-highest goals tally. They are the highest scorers in the bottom four with 15, though Holcombe are one of three teams to have conceded just 11 goals this season, only bettered by Wimbledon's 10.

# MATCH REPORT: W1s 4-4 TEAM BATH BUCCANEERS By Lucas Ball

Holcombe extended their unbeaten run to five matches in all competitions with Saturday's 4-4 home draw against Vitality Division One South strugglers Team Bath Buccaneers.

The hosts, on a four-game winning streak heading into this match, took an early lead through New Zealand international Deanna Ritchie but were quickly pegged back twice by the visitors before Ritchie equalised close to the end of the first quarter.

Australian Jade van der Zwan re-established the advantage for Nick Bandurak's side with her first Holcombe goal early in the second half before two more quick fire Bath goals gave them the lead heading into the final period.

Phoebe Steele levelled from a penalty corner with just over 15 minutes to play but, despite Holcombe's pressure, they were unable to find a winner and are now five points behind league leaders Surbiton 2s.

Lottie Bingham, impressive throughout, was the driving force for Ritchie's first goal, brilliantly driving down the right wing and playing the ball across for the Kiwi to score her seventh goal in four matches.

Tilly Woodhead was called into action to deny a reverse effort minutes later, before saving another shot that led to a Buccaneers penalty corner.

Woodhead kept out the first before a re-award, making another save before the visitors were able to scramble home to equalise.

Another penalty corner gave Bath the lead soon after, the ball deflected in the back post from a variation.

Ritchie had Holcombe level as she made it a brace for herself on the stroke of quarter-time, hitting across goal with the goalkeeper miscuing her kick for the ball to end up in the goal.

Holcombe started to dominate in the second quarter but were unable to capitalise on a number of opportunities. van der Zwan couldn't quite reach Bingham's pass across goal before the latter saw a penalty corner effort saved.

van der Zwan also called the visitors' 'keeper into action just before the half-hour mark before Emma Bandurak drag-flicked wide minutes before the half-time break.

Bath almost made a fast start to the second half, hitting the post just two minutes in but it was Holcombe who re-took the lead. Bandurak opted for a low slap at a penalty corner which was deflected home by van der Zwan for her first in Holcombe colours.

The lead lasted just two minutes, however, as the visitors struck a powerful effort against the post before the rebound was lifted over Woodhead.

The Buccaneers had the lead before the end of the third quarter, too, as an attacker escaped her marker at the far post, superbly finishing from a drilled cross into the top corner.

Steele's third goal of the season was enough to level the scores shortly into the final period, the New Zealander drag-flicking in from a penalty corner.

She was denied again on the hour mark from another set piece before Bandurak also saw a penalty corner strike saved from a variation.

Holcombe piled on the pressure but were unable to break down the visitors' backline late on, the final chance of the match actually coming the way of Bath.

Woodhead made a brilliant save before they won a penalty corner, but the shot was wide.

Holcombe remain second in the table and face Canterbury at Holcombe Park on Saturday (2pm) as part of another double-header with Holcombe's men also in action against Cardiff & Met (6pm). Entry is free and the matches will be streamed on Veo Live.

Team Bath Buccaneers, meanwhile, stay eighth in the table and are back at home this weekend against Wimbledon 2s (1pm), who they are level on points with, the Londoners' goal difference currently superior by one.

# MATCH REPORT: M1s 10-0 BEESTON

Holcombe made it 22 goals scored in their last two matches as Barry Middleton's side thrashed out-of-form Beeston 10-0 on Saturday evening to secure their top-six spot for Phase Two of the Premier Division season alongside Old Georgians, Surbiton, Wimbledon and Hampstead & Westminster.



Fresh from scoring 12 against the University of Nottingham last weekend, Holcombe got off to a flyer with three goals in the first eight

### minutes from Nick Bandurak, Phil Roper and Tom Russell.

Roper, Alex Pendle and Rob Field added to the score before half-time to give the hosts a six-goal lead before Russell added two more for a hattrick in the second half, alongside another goal from Bandurak and one from Sam Taylor.

Beeston have now conceded 35 goals in their last four matches and face another tough match at home to Hampstead & Westminster this weekend, the London side currently fifth in the table.



Holcombe were the clear favourites heading into the game and a blistering start soon removed any jeopardy from the match, the away side stunned and unable to get back into the game, rarely threatening following that early Holcombe flurry, despite forcing Ollie Payne into action inside the first minute.

Bandurak fired over just a minute later before scoring superbly. He brilliantly controlled a Taylor aerial into the circle, before lifting over the onrushing Taylor Craigie.

Roper saw a goal disallowed controversially soon after, the umpire ruling that he was outside the circle but there was no doubting his strike two minutes later. Middleton brilliantly tackled high up the pitch before finding Bandurak who played in Roper, the Great Britain forward hitting powerfully across goal into the far corner.

Hayden Phillips forced a good save from the 'keeper in the build-up to the third goal for Holcombe, Rhodri Furlong eventually picking the ball up on the edge of the circle, pushing into a dangerous area for Russell to deflect home.



A slick move fed the ball to Roper in space early in the second quarter, the former Wimbledon man making no mistake as he fired in on the reverse clinically before another excellent move, this time down the right-hand-side, saw Middleton feed Russell, the latter squaring for Alex Pendle to score his fifth goal in four matches.

Pendle almost made it a third brace in Holcombe colours just before the half-hour mark as he hit a powerful effort wide from the top of the circle, with Beeston forcing Payne into a superb stop from a penalty corner just after.

A penalty corner at the other end led to Holcombe's sixth as Field dragflicked past Craigie to make it six before half-time.

Bandurak almost teed up Roper for a hat-trick as he flashed a reverse across goal, before Guise-Brown drag-flicked over the bar and Bandurak was twice denied all in the opening minutes of the third quarter. Russell deflected in from Bandurak's hit midway through the quarter to extend Holcombe's advantage, before Bandurak scored his 16th of the season two minutes later after Taylor delicately set up the Holcombe captain.

Russell completed his hat-trick before the end of the third quarter, sliding to slap home from Field's pass across goal after a fast counterattack.



Bandurak saw a drag-flick saved around five minutes into the final period, with Taylor picking up the rebound to score his third goal of the season, before Beeston had a mini-resurgence in the final ten minutes, forcing Payne to make a couple of saves.

Holcombe are at home again on Saturday as part of another doubleheader, the women in action against Kent rivals Canterbury at 2pm before Middleton's side take on 10th-placed Cardiff & Met at 6pm, who have lost their last three matches – conceding 21 goals in the process.

Beeston take on Hampstead & Westminster at the Nottingham Hockey Centre at 6pm on Saturday, looking for their first win since October 14th, when they beat point-less University of Nottingham 4-0 in a local derby.

# **RHODRI FURLONG LOOKING TO MAKE "SOMETHING SPECIAL'' HAPPEN AT** HOLCOMBE By Lucas Ball

Wales international Rhodri Furlong has been impressed with the start that Holcombe have made to their Premier Division campaign, with Barry Middleton's side having secured a top-six spot for Phase Two with two games to spare.

Now in his second season with the club, the former Hampstead & Westminster midfielder has his eyes sit firmly on delivering a maiden Premier Division title to Holcombe, having finished as runners-up last season after losing to Old Georgians in the league final.

Holcombe currently sit three points behind both Old Georgians and Surbiton, the reigning champions ahead of the Londoners on goal difference only. Wimbledon, Hampstead & Westminster and Southgate currently round out the top-six, with only Kwan Browne's side yet to confirm their spot in the top-six for Phase Two when the league splits after Christmas.

Winning the title would lead to another Euro Hockey League campaign, with Holcombe narrowly beaten in this season's KO8 by hosts Real Club de Polo de Barcelona.

Speaking ahead of Holcombe's clash with Cardiff, Furlong said: "We've got off to a really positive start and I think we've come into our own this year.

"There were some new additions at the start of last season, myself included, and now most of us have had a year together, we've gelled quite nicely.

"We've got a good identity as a team and the hockey that we play is exciting

to watch and we score lots of goals. It's a really, really positive place for us at the moment - long may it continue!

"That's always the aim in this first half of the season - to secure top-six.

'We've done that and we've done that early, I think it's important that we keep trying to push ourselves so the last two games that we've got coming up against Cardiff and Hampstead, if we win both of those then that puts us in a very strong position to challenge for the league in the next phase.

"We've done job one, we've ticked it off, get top-six - that's secured and now we can start thinking a little bit more towards what's going to happen after Christmas and putting ourselves in the strongest possible position to be title contenders.



"Europe was brilliant, that's probably one of the best trips I've been on and I've been on a fair few with Wales and played in a lot of tournaments around the world.

"Barcelona was brilliant, obviously it was a shame we couldn't get over the line against Real Club de Polo but I'm hoping that we'll be back there next year and we'll see what we can make happen."

Holcombe's only league defeats this season have come at the hands of Old Georgians and Wimbledon, with poor spells within the match costing Holcombe as they conceded more than once in quick succession.

Those spells left them with too much work to do in either match despite

### neither side outplaying Middleton's men across the 70 minutes.

Furlong said: "It's about consistency, we can be - I'd argue - one of the strongest teams, if not the strongest, on our given day - we beat Surbiton at finals weekend and beat them at the league, but beating the top sides is about delivering those performances consistently - week in, week out.

"That's something we're going to have to do to make sure that we put ourselves in the best possible situation to win the league. That's the bit we need to add, just a little bit more consistency and then hopefully we can make something special happen by either winning the play-offs or win the league.



"When it comes to the best teams in the league, matches are normally defined by tight margins so what happens in either circle.

"In both the Wimbledon and Old Georgians matches, we lost that side - they put goals in, we didn't score enough and didn't take our chances, especially against Wimbledon.

"It's something that we're aware of and we're working on, we've shown that we can score a lot of goals consistently, there have been some very highscoring games in our favour and now we need to step it up and continue to do it against the bigger teams."

Furlong, one of a number of new signings last summer, saw Alex Pendle, Brad Read and Louis Duprez join ahead of this campaign. Now in a more settled role, Furlong's own performances have improved immensely from the start of his Holcombe career, while he has also been impressed by this season's new additions. "I've been given a little bit more licence this year to get involved and that's in part due to the tactics that we've adopted.

"On the whole I think it always takes a little bit of time to settle in when you join a new team, obviously I've been playing hockey for a very long time but how you fit into your role within a given team varies.

"It look me a little bit of time to find my feet but from the World Cup onwards, I felt like I knew exactly what I was there to do, Barry gave me very clear instructions and a clear game plan to follow.

"The performances are certainly getting better so it's just about contributing what I can contribute to make sure we keep winning.



"Pendle's been on the goal sheet a fair amount and he's transitioned into the team seamlessly.

"Louis' been very good, he's very solid and quite experienced so again, a very good addition.

Brad's excellent, a really experienced head, he's played at the highest level obviously he's been at Holcombe before - and he's been a brilliant addition, he's had a really strong season so far. He adds a lot." As the sole Welsh representative in Holcombe's squad, Furlong will face a side littered with his international teammates this weekend as Holcombe bid to further boost their title chances while next weekend, he will come up against one of his former clubs in Hampstead & Westminster at Paddington Recreational Ground.

'I know a lot of the Cardiff guys very well, I've probably played with six, seven or eight of them for around 10 years so I'm really looking forward to it, it'll be great to see them, to play against them.

"They've managed to get in the Prem which is brilliant for Cardiff as a club and Wales as a country but ultimately I'm a Holcombe hockey player, we'll be



looking to come away with the full three points. It'll be nice to see some old friends and catch up with them after in the bar.

"Hampstead are a very strong side, I played there for a number of years before moving to Holcombe so I know a lot of the boys really well and have a great deal of respect for the club and those guys.

"Again, ultimately, we need to get the three points to put us in the best possible position for next year. It'll be a challenge, they're a strong outfit at the moment and it will be a really good challenge for us but I believe that we've got enough to get us over the line.

"It won't be an easy game by any means and we're going to have to win both circles to get the result that we want."

This weekend's match forms part of a second consecutive first-team doubleheader with Holcombe's women's side also in action against Kent rivals Canterbury at 2pm ahead of the men's game at 6pm.

Furlong told how much he enjoys playing at Holcombe Park, praising both the supporters and the improved coverage of fixtures as a whole this season across the Premier Division.

"The double-headers are brilliant. Playing at Holcombe Park is definitely favoured, it gives us a massive advantage.

"People don't like coming to Holcombe Park because our record there is very good, which is something we need to keep defending.

"We normally get a brilliant crowd out, the atmosphere's really good, really positive and we've got a great set up in that we've got the bar at the pitch so hopefully we can get the win and then go and enjoy ourselves afterwards.

"I think it's brilliant, we need to get hockey out there to grow the game.

"For other players, other fans - they should be able to watch the highest level of hockey, watch highlights and engage with it, it's not always possible to get down to games.

"Most of the Premier Division clubs are south-based, I think the most northern are Beeston and the University of Nottingham, there's no one in the north playing in the Prem anymore so people up there might struggle to get down and see a game at the highest level so it makes perfect sense to stream the games and put up highlights to give everyone an opportunity to see what it's about."

Holcombe face two more Phase One fixtures against Cardiff & Met and Hampstead & Westminster before the Christmas break, returning to indoor action in January ahead of Phase Two.

Both first-team matches are free to watch at Holcombe Park on Saturday and will be streamed on Veo Live, with updates also available across the club's social media channels.






