MATCH PREVIEW – W1s vs. BARNES By Lucas Ball

Holcombe are looking for a third straight Division One South victory as Nick Bandurak's side welcome promotion rivals Barnes to Holcombe Park on Saturday afternoon (2pm).

Holcs scored 12 goals in two matches last weekend to move a point behind Barnes with two games to play - this weekend's visitors also heading to table-toppers Surbiton 2s next weekend.

Those two big victories also returned Bandurak's side to the top of the scoring charts, with 53 strikes in 16 matches giving Holcs an average of more than three goals per game.

Barnes are the third-highest-scorers in the league with 36 in 16, 10 behind Surbiton 2s. The visitors also sit third in the defensive standings, with 24 conceded compared to 20 for Sevenoaks and 23 for Surbiton 2s, with Holcs just a goal further back with 25 against in 16.

Omar Shibli's side ran out 5-2 winners at Dukes Meadow in the reverse fixture in a disappointing afternoon for Holcombe as Barnes went 4-0 up inside the opening 23 minutes.

If Holcombe win, promotion would be in their own hands next weekend, just needing to beat relegation-threatened Wimbledon 2s at Holcombe Park. A win against Barnes followed by a draw against Wimbledon 2s would also likely be enough for an immediate Premier Division return given Holcs' superior goal difference.

If Saturday's match ends in a draw, a win for Barnes on the last day would seal promotion. A draw for Holcombe next time out could then be enough if Barnes lose to Surbiton 2s next weekend.

If Barnes take all three points, promotion would be secured for the London side, who also have three former Holcombe players in Maddie Pearce, Alice Huddlestone and Carolina Kappes. Entry is free at Holcombe Park on Saturday and updates will be provided across Holcombe's social media channels.

MATCH PREVIEW -M1s vs. HAMPSTEAD & WESTMINSTER By Lucas Ball

Holcombe are looking for a third consecutive Premier Division win as Barry Middleton's side welcome Hampstead & Westminster to Holcombe Park on Saturday evening (6pm).

Holcs signed off from Phase Two with back-to-back victories against Hampstead and Southgate following three straight defeats, though key players Nick Bandurak, Phil Roper, Hayden Phillips and Tom Russell all missed at least one match in Phase Two.

Finishing in fourth means Holcombe are in Pool A for Phase Three alongside the same teams as last season, with fixtures against Hampstead, Beeston and Old Georgians to come.

Two wins out of three will likely be enough to secure back-toback appearances at League Finals weekend and another chance at qualifying for the Euro Hockey League (EHL), where Holcs were knocked out at the KO8 stage earlier this season.

Middleton's side have won five consecutive matches against the Londoners since the start of last season, including winning 2-1 just two weekends ago at Holcombe Park courtesy of goals from Alex Pendle and Russell.

Pendle and penalty corner specialist Tim Guise-Brown will be hoping to continue their recent goalscoring form, with Pendle having scored in his last two matches and Guise-Brown scoring two drag-flicks in his last three matches.

Andrew Wilson's side concluded their Phase Two campaign with a 3-0 home defeat to Surbiton, goals from Luke Taylor (2) and James Gall inflicting an eighth defeat of the campaign on the Londoners.

Wilson's men finish Phase Two as the lowest scorers in the top-eight with 39, though Oxted and Beeston did face different opponents in Phase Two.

Their 40 goals conceded is the second-highest tally in the Top Six, only worsened by Southgate who have conceded 53 in 16.

Holcs, meanwhile, sit third in the scoring charts with 62 in 16 matches and are top of the defensive rankings with just 20 goals against in 16 matches.

Entry is free at Holcombe Park on Saturday and updates will be provided across Holcombe's social media channels.

MATCH REPORT - TEAM BATH BUCCANEERS 0-6 W1s

Holcombe earned their second Division One South win in as many days on Sunday afternoon as Nick Bandurak's side defeated Team Bath Buccaneers 6-0 at the University of Bath.

A brace from Marian Ledesma alongside goals from Catherine Ledesma, Lottie Bingham, Deanna Ritchie and Bethan Hodges gave Holcs the three points in a dominant display where the visitors also had more than 10 penalty corners and the hosts' goalkeeper put in an exceptional display to limit the scoring.

It marked a ruthless weekend for Holcombe who also put six past Kent rivals Canterbury on Saturday, with six points the minimum requirement over the weekend to keep the pressure on promotion rivals Barnes heading into Saturday's fixture against them at Holcombe Park (2pm).

Those 12 goals in two matches restored Holcs to the top of the scoring standings as they moved to 53 goals in 16, seven ahead of the next-nearest team, Surbiton 2s.

The two victories also put Holcs a point behind Barnes heading into this weekend, with two matches to play as both sides bid for the required second-placed finish to be promoted to the Premier Division, with table-toppers Surbiton 2s unable to go up.

Whoever does finish second will join Sutton Coldfield – Division One North champions – in winning promotion to the top-flight, with Holcs having already won promotion to the Super 6s Premier Division with

Sutton Coldfield in January.

Holcs' dominance was evident from early on, on Sunday, as they pressed for an opener throughout the first quarter but were denied through a combination of last-ditch defending and great goalkeeping.

That dominance continued throughout the whole 70 minutes, but it took until six minutes before the half-time break for the deadlock to be broken as Marian Ledesma scored her first goal of the match and first of the season.

Catherine Ledesma made it two goals in as many matches and three in her last six four minutes later as Holcs ensured they went into the halftime break two goals to the good.

Bingham netted inside seven minutes of the second half for her sixth Division One South goal of the season, before Ritchie made it four six minutes later with her 13th outdoor goal of the season in all competitions.

Marian Ledesma added her second with nine minutes remaining as Holcs made their dominance pay, before Hodges added her second goal in as many days late on.

It was an exceptional performance from minute one to 70 for Bandurak's side as they created countless chances, with a number of players putting in outstanding performances including both Ledesma's, Bingham, Hannah Bond and Hodges.

Holcs simply did not let their opponents get into the game and on another day may have had even more goals but for some resolute goalkeeping.

Bandurak's side now face promotion rivals Barnes at Holcombe Park at 2pm on Saturday – entry is free and updates will be provided across Holcombe's social media channels.

MATCH REPORT -SOUTHGATE 0-3 M1s By Lucas Ball

Holcombe made it back-to-back wins to end Phase Two as they won 3-0 at Southgate on Saturday evening courtesy of goals from Alex Pendle, Tim Guise-Brown and Louis Duprez.

Holcs, having already secured a fourth-placed finish, travelled to the Southgate Hockey Centre with just 13 players due to a host of injuries but put in an impressive performance to take the three points and head into Phase Three off the back of two consecutive victories.

Pendle gave Holcs the lead with his second goal in as many matches, forcing a save from close range before tidily finishing off the rebound. Guise-Brown added a second with a great drag-flick midway through the third quarter before Duprez, deployed in a more advanced role than usual, deflected a pass across goal in just three minutes later.

The first quarter was a scrappy affair, though there were chances at both ends. Barry Middleton forced a good save from South African Anton van Loggerenberg on the reverse early on before Ollie Payne made two good saves in quick succession at the other end.

It was then Holcombe's turn to work the 'keeper again, with Tom O'Keeffe's hit stopped well by van Loggerenberg.

Pendle came close to opening the scoring early on in Q2 as he deflected narrowly wide from Rhodri Furlong's pass.

The goal came after good work from Guise-Brown down the righthand-side following an aerial, he won a penalty corner and then saw his drag-flick deflected off-the-line by Kwan Browne. Holcs worked the ball back into the circle, with Pendle seeing his first effort blocked by van Loggerenberg before squeezing the rebound past the 'keeper.

Pendle was involved again as he and captain Rob Field almost linked up for a chance at a second, before Guise-Brown saw another penalty

corner effort charged down.

Payne made a great save from a Southgate penalty corner at the other end to keep Holcs' clean sheet intact, before two consecutive Southgate corners one again worked the Great Britain goalkeeper after a initial mis-trap at the re-award.

A scramble in the circle followed Payne's save as Southgate looked to loop an effort over the 'keeper, with Holcombe eventually winning a free hit to clear the danger and head into the half-time break a goal up.

Duprez saw a powerful effort well-saved early on in the third period before Guise-Brown was brilliantly denied by van Loggerenberg at another penalty corner.

At the next corner, however, there was no stopping Guise-Brown as he scored his second in the last three matches and made it two goals in Holcombe's last two away matches. Furlong forced van Loggerenberg into action again before Middleton won the corner, Guise-Brown dispatching the drag-flick to double Holcs' lead.

Duprez then deflected in for a third just three minutes later before Southgate almost reduced the arrears near the end of the quarter, firing an effort into the side-netting.

Payne made another good save at a Southgate corner early on in the last quarter, with a second effort high over the bar before another string of corners ended in a shot off-target from the hosts.

Holcombe sat deep late on to keep their clean sheet intact, defending well to limit Southgate's chances with tired legs starting to show as the hosts enjoyed a three-man advantage in their squad.

The hosts did still win a penalty corner on the final whistle, with Middleton clearing off-the-line with a huge deflection away to ensure Holcombe took the three points and kept a fifth clean sheet of the season and move to the top of the defensive rankings, with just 20 conceded in 16 matches.

Holcs will now face Old Georgians, Hampstead & Westminster and

Beeston in Phase Three as Pool A features the same teams as last season.

MATCH REPORT -CANTERBURY 2-6 W1s

By Lucas Ball Holcombe picked up their first Division One South victory in four matches as Nick Bandurak's side beat Canterbury 6-2 at Polo Farm on Saturday afternoon, with six different players getting on the scoresheet.

Catherine Ledesma and Leisa Randall scored within five minutes of each other in the second quarter before the hosts halved the deficit through Lottie McDonnell on the stroke of half-time before Hattie Jones re-established Holcs' two-goal lead in the third quarter.

Emma Bandurak added a fourth for Holcs five minutes later before Hannah Griggs pulled another back for Canterbury with 11 minutes remaining. Goals in the last six minutes from Deanna Ritchie and Bethan Hodges put Holcombe further in charge, with Hodges scoring her first outdoor goal for the club from a late penalty corner.

Holcombe started well with Lottie Bingham teeing up Ledesma early on to hit the post before Marian Ledesma forced Rebecca MacKinnon into a strong save on the reverse.

Tilly Woodhead then had to be alert at the other end to clear a dangerous-looking Canterbury ball across goal before the two sides went into the first break goalless.

Catherine Ledesma then gave Holcs the lead inside six minutes of the restart with a reverse finish into the corner, before Phoebe Steele forced MacKinnon into action from a penalty corner.

Randall was then able to double the advantage after being played through, sliding in to finish past MacKinnon on the reverse.

Ritchie could have added to that tally with two chances in quick

succession, the second agonisingly wide of the far post.

Woodhead was then called into action again, clearing an initial shot but the ball fell to McDonnell, whose powerful strike beat the 'keeper with just over a minute to play until half-time.

Holcombe continued to enjoy the lion's share of the chances, Mel Clewlow blocking well from a Steele drag-flick at another penalty corner, this time the ball dropped to Catherine Ledesma again who saw an effort saved by MacKinnon.

Bandurak's side were confident in pushing numbers forward and played some free-flowing hockey, Jones stealing a march into the circle to pick up a loose ball and fire past MacKinnon from close range.

Ledesma came close once more with another reverse strike before she saw another shot deflected off-target at a penalty corner after a mistrap at the top of the circle.

The move leading up to the fourth goal was Holcombe's best of the match with some brilliant quick movements and passing including a first-time reverse pass through her own legs from Marian Ledesma. The ball eventually found Ritchie whose deflection was well-stopped before the rebound fell to Ledesma, who was bundled over as she was about to strike.

Bandurak made no mistake from the penalty spot to make it 4-1, with Holcs now in cruise control and creating chances almost at will as Canterbury struggled to cope with their movement and quick interchanges.

Another penalty corner resulted in a free hit out with Bandurak's flick adjudged to be too high on the number one runner, before MacKinnon did well to deny Bingham as the England under-21 international tried to round the goalkeeper.

Bandurak saw another corner effort saved onto a Canterbury foot in the circle, with the re-award well-defended to ensure Canterbury went into the final break just the three goals behind.

Despite that dominance, it was the hosts who struck first in the final period as Griggs reduced the arrears for Ollie Lumley's side.

Holcombe had to ride out a rocky period after conceding that goal but did so well and regained their composure to finish the game strongly, with Ritchie finishing off a penalty corner after Bandurak's initial hit was blocked.

Four minutes later, Hodges was on hand to deflect Bandurak's slap home for her first outdoor Holcombe goal after signing for the club in January.

The victory keeps Holcombe four points behind Barnes who also won on Saturday, with a game-in-hand against Team Bath Buccaneers ahead of hosting Barnes at Holcombe Park next Saturday.

Canterbury, meanwhile, slip into the relegation zone with Saturday's defeat as Wimbledon 2s won against Bath.



LEISA RANDALL: "WE HAVE A REAL STATEMENT TO MAKE" ON SATURDAY By Lucas Ball

Leisa Randall was impressed by the statement Holcombe put out by scoring 12 goals in their last two matches over a double-header weekend and now wants the team to follow that up with a win against promotion rivals Barnes.



Victory on Saturday afternoon (2pm) at Holcombe Park would put promotion in Holcombe's hands with one match remaining in Division One South, with Holcs set to face Wimbledon 2s at home on the last day (23rd March, 2pm).

Six points out of six against two relegation-threatened teams in Canterbury and Team Bath Buccaneers moved Holcs to within a point of Barnes, with Surbiton 2s unable to be promoted despite being top of the table. Barnes beat Holcombe 5-2 at Dukes Meadow in November, but Randall also admits the team are keen to avenge that disappointing defeat.

Two wins out of two would seal an immediate return to the Premier Division for Nick Bandurak's side following last season's relegation alongside Buckingham, who have been pipped to the Division One North title by Sutton Coldfield – Holcs were promoted from the Super 6s Division One alongside Sutton Coldfield in January.

She said: "Two huge wins, six points, 12 goals, it was nice to get a goal as well.

"It's massive, massive points on the board not just in terms of winning but also putting out a statement that we're here to not just get the points but get those goals.

"In the first game we had six different scorers and there were a lot of field goals this weekend too, we weren't relying on corners which is great.

"We worked the ball around well, scored deflections, scored all different types of goals and it didn't matter who was getting the goals, it was just about getting the goals which was quite nice.

"Two away days too, one obviously slightly closer than the other with one being re-arranged – I'm glad that it didn't snow!

"The way that we started both games holds us in great stead for the weekend coming up with obviously a huge game on the horizon.

"Going into that with 12 goals makes us feel pretty good heading into that but that's why tonight [speaking ahead of training on Wednesday night] is very important to make sure we're really in the right headspace for this game because is this huge.

"I think going into this game, we know the last one against them didn't feel good, we knew that we'd lost.

"I don't want to say we let ourselves down because I don't mean it like

that but we knew our standards and we know what we're capable of doing.

"We have a real statement to make now at home, this is our ground, it's completely different to their pitch.

"I don't know who they're bringing but we have that home advantage and, as a team, we've basically been treating these last few games as almost a cup run-up, knockout style so this is essentially onto the semifinal.

"That seems to be working for us as a group, taking each game as it comes and doing the preparation for each game. We've played them once, we know what they're going to do, we know their players, it's just now building training around that to cater for that game.

"It would be nice to turn it around at the first time of asking.

"As a team last year, we all felt that we weren't where we needed to be, there were different players.

"In the last game, it was clear who'd been there long-term and who'd been there short-term.

"This year, it's not like that, regardless of how long you've been here for half a season, a year or 20 years, it makes no difference because everyone is fighting for the same thing in promotion.

"We're a team and we pick each other up, we see when people are in holes and we get them out.

"Especially for me, I've been around the team for years, knowing that there isn't a person in that team that I wouldn't play for is such a good feeling."

Randall's goal against Canterbury, a sliding reverse finish, took her tally to five for the season, with Bandurak's side having racked up 53 goals in 16 Division One South matches (the most in the division), as well as nine goals in two cup games against Trojans and Wimbledon 2s.

Saturday's result also meant that Holcombe completed a league double over Kent rivals Canterbury, scoring 13 goals in two matches and conceding just three, while also beating the Polo Farm outfit 7-1 in the indoor season.



"100%, for me there's nothing better than a derby day and I've played against Canterbury for so many years, it's always huge whether it's home or away and it's literally survival of the fittest when you're out there.

"No team wants to lose and it was great to get the points on the day, they did get a couple of goals but at no point were we too concerned that we weren't going to win the game. Personally, it felt like we were in control for the whole game bar maybe a five, 10-minute window of small errors but overall, I never felt like we were going to lose the game.

"It's nice to get on the scoresheet on a derby day, too, playing against people that I've played since I was small.

"You've got players like Mel Clewlow, a massive player for them, after the game coming up to me and saying 'great goal', it's just nice in the hockey community that there's that respect between players, especially knowing that going into that game they're also in a relegation battle, it was a huge game for them and massive for us because we want to get the promotion.

"It was great to win both games.

"After being clipped in the video and getting that, the first thing when it

came up was that I need to watch this back – in the moment, it felt like it was really good but I watched it back and thought 'why have I gone to ground there?'

"In the moment, it looked great though, and a goal's a goal – love a backhand!

"It was a nice passage of play – Les [Catherine Ledesma] and I always seem to have these small moments where we make that eye contact and I know that she's going to chuck a ball, I've just got to get on the end of it and put it in the goal.

"It's nice to score, it doesn't really matter how it goes in – the photos were interesting but obviously it means a lot! Scoring five goals for the season for a forward is huge, forwards get confidence from goals so it's always nice to score.

"Not bad [on hearing Holcombe have averaged more than three goals per league game this season] – we doubled that in both games this weekend!

"It puts us in a good position for the weekend.

"Especially last year, we went through phases of forwards not being confident and knowing we could get the ball there but in that final 25, we weren't scoring – there was a lot of pressure on forwards to score and naturally it doesn't happen when there is pressure on that but I think definitely since starting back, we found our rhythm again and just know where the goal is, which is huge.

"It's three huge points to gain on the weekend and I have no doubt that we'll score goals, it's just how many."

The forward is the longest-serving Holcombe player in the squad and was around the squad when Holcombe won promotion from the Conference East to the Premier Division back in 2013.

Randall is one of two players remaining from that squad alongside captain Harriet Pittard and knows what promotion would mean to the club, encouraging Holcombe supporters to pack out the terrace this weekend to get behind the team, recalling the noise having a huge impact in earlier games this season.

Now one of the more experienced players in the team, Randall also has plenty of advice for some of the younger players coming through the set-up.

"From last year, having the relegation was not only massive for the team but also as a club, this would've been our ninth year in the Premier Division and I'm one of the very few players that remember being in the Conference before and us getting into the Prem.

"Last year obviously hurt because not many people really understood what that meant not only for players but for the club – we worked hard to get there and then to stay in that league.

"This game is really the statement that everyone's looking for, this is the grudge match that everyone wants, we've been looking forward to this game knowing that this is the big one, and it would be a real statement for us to beat them, take the three points and say 'it's up to you now, come for us'.

"100%, the crowd has helped us so much in some games.

"The more people that are here the better.

"I've grown up here, played at the club since I was 10, there is no better feeling than being out there, hearing the crowd and knowing that even if you make a mistake, the crowd have got your back.



"If decisions don't go your way, you know they're there fighting your corner and they give you that bit of a boost if you're chasing a player and don't think you're going to make it, that boost to at least stay in the contest and do something with that.

"I just think it's so important, of all of the games this season, this is going to be the one that we need as many voices as we can get.

"If we win this game, we have one game left to win and get promotion, it's massive. It's nice to be on this side of it and not the relegation side, it's great to be building towards something for next year.

"I see youngsters like [Hannah] Carney coming through, I've been her wanting to break into a team, yes there's obviously nerves, a little bit of fear for the youngsters but they also play without that fear, they internalise it but their game doesn't show that.

"Everyone is nervous, whatever age – Saturday is huge, people are going to be nervous but it's how you turn those nerves into something positive in the game.

"As a group, we're going to be pumped for this – there will be nerves, we will make mistakes but I don't think that will define us in this game.

"We've played almost the whole season now and I think we know how to turn that into something good.

"Our average age is probably mid-20s but there isn't anyone in that team who can't slot in and put in a shift, regardless of whether you're the youngest or oldest and I'm now obviously nearer the older age of that bracket but I've been the youngest in the team, it's nice to see that generational thing coming through.

"For someone like Carney, she is the next generation, she's another home-grown player and there aren't many of us at the club.

"But you've also got people like Phoebe [Steele], Hannah Bond, all of our newbies this year, you wouldn't know that they haven't been part of this team for a long time. "Everyone's slotted in so well and as a team, regardless of what team you're in that week, who you're with in that drill warming up, it makes no difference because we're all mates on and off-the-pitch, that helps to build a team."

Holcombe will have Easter weekend off following the conclusion of their league campaign ahead of a cup semi-final trip to Doncaster on April 7th, with Surbiton 2s and Beeston meeting in the other last-four clash.

Bandurak's side have beaten Trojans and Wimbledon 2s to get to this stage, scoring nine and conceded five in the process.

Randall added: "We wanted to come into this season, looking to get promoted but we were all under no illusions that we wanted to do the treble as well [indoor and outdoor promotion, cup].

"Why not test ourselves? Yes, we want to get promoted but we've done indoor, we're in the mix for promotion and everyone loves a cup run.

"We love an away day apparently too! Doncaster away, we've never played them before, it'll be a huge game but also for them, we want to send a statement out again that you don't know us, but this is what we're about, this is why we're doing so well in our league and then hopefully we can get to the final.

"It's two league games and hopefully two cup games left and then the season's over, which is quite sad!"

Entry is free at Holcombe Park on Saturday with Holcombe's men also in action against Hampstead & Westminster at 6pm. Updates will be provided for both games across Holcombe's social media channels.

MATCH REPORT -M1s 2-1 HAMPSTEAD & WESTMINSTER

Holcombe earned their first three points of Phase Two at the fourth attempt with a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Hampstead & Westminster on Saturday evening at Holcombe Park courtesy of goals from Alex Pendle and Tom Russell.

It was Barry Middleton's side fifth win over the Londoners in their last five meetings since the start of last season, with the two sides now guaranteed to meet in Phase Three after securing fourth (Holcombe) and fifth-placed (Hampstead & Westminster) finishes respectively.

With Old Georgians also securing top spot over the weekend – and therefore a Euro Hockey League spot for 2024/25 – it leaves three of the four sides in Pool A as the same sides from last season, while Beeston – also in Pool A last season – could still join them.

Finishing in fourth does mean that Holcombe will have two home games in Phase Three, though there is one more Phase Two match to come – away at Southgate this Saturday, 9th March (6pm).

Holcombe's fast starts in both Q1 and Q2 on Saturday proved too much for their opponents and they may well have had more goals on another day, with Toby Reynolds-Cotterill making a number of strong saves throughout despite Holcs' injury woes – worsened by Russell's departure midway through this encounter.

It took just three minutes for birthday boy Pendle to score – Tim Guise-Brown, playing against his brother, Matt, sent a long aerial into the circle, a defender's mis-trap allowing Pendle to steal in and smash a bouncing ball through Great Britain international Reynolds-Cotterill to give the hosts an early advantage. That was Pendle's ninth league goal of the season and he could have reached double figures a few minutes later when Russell brilliantly put the GB Elite Development Programme (EDP) man through on goal, though Pendle's shot was too high on this occasion.

Within 15 seconds of the second period, Middleton's men had doubled their lead. Hampstead almost immediately gave the ball away from their pushback, allowing Pendle to find Middleton, who played the perfect pass through to Russell, the forward's shot squeezing through Reynolds-Cotterill's legs for his 13th competitive outdoor goal of the season in 16 appearances.

Guise-Brown then forced a save from Reynolds-Cotterill from a tight angle before the visitors pulled one back through Joe Hillyer on the halfhour mark.

A string of penalty corners for both sides brought no more goals either side of a break in play for Russell's injury, with Hampstead coming closest after forcing Ollie Payne into a double save.

It was Holcombe who, once again, started the third period more brightly as Tom O'Keeffe and Guise-Brown forced more saves in the opening six minutes of the second half, before Payne made a super save from a Hampstead penalty corner at the other end after a drag-flick deflected off Sam Taylor.

The visitors squandered perhaps their best chance to equalise early in the final period as a close-range effort was lifted over the bar, before two penalty corners saw no damage to the Holcombe goal in the early exchanges of the fourth quarter.

Following that, however, Holcs stood firm in defence and actually came closer to re-establishing their two-goal lead when Jake Owen forced two saves from Reynolds-Cotterill with around three minutes remaining on the clock.

TIM GUISE-BROWN: FIRST PREMIER DIVISION TITLE WOULD BE "REALLY SPECIAL" FOR HOLCOMBE

Tim Guise-Brown says that Holcombe are confident of a strong end to the season after finishing Phase Two of their Premier Division season with back-to-back wins against this weekend's opponents Hampstead & Westminster and Southgate.

Holcs lost their first three Phase Three matches to the eventual topthree, though key players Nick Bandurak, Phil Roper, Hayden Phillips and Tom Russell have all missed different matches through injury.

Barry Middleton's side ended up finishing fourth at the end of Phase Two, earning a spot in Pool A alongside Old Georgians, Hampstead & Westminster and Beeston, the same three teams that took part in last season's Pool A, with Holcs and Old Georgians qualifying for Premier Division Finals.

A second-placed finish at League Finals secured Holcs' Euro Hockey League (EHL) spot for earlier this season, though Guise-Brown says the team are aiming to go one step further this season.

He said: "That is obviously the end goal, you want to win the league, win the title.

"We've had the same core group working together for about three seasons now so it would be just reward for us as a group if we could achieve that and it would be really special to do it for the first time for the club.

"It was an unreal experience [playing at the Euro Hockey League in October].

"I think now that all the boys have had a taste of it, we're quite keen on getting back and righting the wrongs, we're very disappointed with the way it finished and we'd like another bite.

"It was a pretty decent finish to Phase Two, there's never any easy games playing against the Top Six but that's exactly what you want.

"It was nice to finish Phase Two with two wins so we can carry the momentum into the real crunch time in Phase Three, with probably the most important game of the three being the first one against Hampstead & Westminster so hopefully we can continue that forward momentum and bring it into Saturday's game.

"Absolutely, winning those games without some key players adds a new level of confidence amongst the boys.



"It's never nice not having your full strength squad but still being able to win two very impressive games without arguably our best players definitely adds a new element of, like I said, confidence to the group and now that we've got some of them coming back, it shows how strong the unit is and I'd like to think we can put on a pretty impressive display this weekend now we've got some more of our firepower back.

"We definitely have got a lot of confidence at the moment but we'll never under-estimate their ability, they have got some serious threats across the field, some really good players up front and a really good flicker.

"We'll definitely be confident going into the game but we won't take anything for granted.

"We know that on our day we can beat any team in the league so if we can get the positive results within Phase Three and set ourselves for a straight shootout at Play-Offs, we definitely back our chances but we're just focusing on this weekend first and then we'll go from there.

"It's long overdue, it's time for us to beat them [Old Georgians] for the first time in a while, we know it won't be easy and you've got to be switched on for the full 70 minutes to even have a shot at beating them.

"As long as we do that, we know that the game plan will be on point, we just have to go out there and execute the game plan."

Saturday's win against Southgate was made all the more impressive by Holcombe only travelling with 13 players, meaning tired legs could have easily taken effect late on. Holcs were able to hold onto their clean sheet, however, a fifth of the season for Ollie Payne which also means Holcombe are back to the top of the defensive rankings with just 20 goals conceded in 16 matches.

"We had to ask a lot of each other against Southgate.

"I think it clicked on Saturday for us, it's some of the best I've seen a lot of the boys play before, particularly with our link-up play going forward and our ability to keep the ball under pressure, that meant we were able to save some of the legs.

"Everyone came off the field extremely tired having put in a really big shift and it was just an impressive performance all-round, especially from the second quarter to the beginning of the fourth, we were in control for the majority of the game. "We take a lot of pride in our defending and we work on it a lot in training.

"Having someone like David Ames as your assistant coach really does help you learn a lot in terms of the tricks of the trade and then when you've got Ollie Payne behind you, it does just add confidence.

"Would we have as many clean sheets without him? Absolutely not, so it's credit to how good he is but also credit to the work the boys put in, in training sessions."

After scoring again against Southgate, Guise-Brown has two goals in his last three matches having also scored away to Wimbledon. Saturday's goal took his tally to six for the season ahead of facing his brother, Matt, this weekend.

Guise-Brown also scored a brace against Hampstead at Paddington Recreational back in November, in Holcombe's last Phase One fixture.

"It's nice to be able to contribute anywhere on the field but in particular with the goals.

"Again, penalty corners are something we work hard at during training sessions so when they come off during games, it makes it that much nicer.

"It's not easy being a flicker but it's a lot sweeter when it does come off and it makes all the hours that you put in a lot more rewarding.

"There was one on Saturday where it's a good save by the post-man, another really good save by the 'keeper, it's one of those where you just have to bide your time and it'll come around."

Entry is free for Saturday's match at Holcombe Park (6pm), with Holcombe's women also in action in a crucial promotion match at 2pm. Updates of both matches will be provided on Holcombe's social media channels.



The top-two from each pool qualify for League Finals weekend at Sugden Road, Surbiton HC on the 13th and 14th April.

yesterday.


